The Condition of this Obligation is such that if hereafter there shall not appear any lawfull Act or Imprudiment by reason of any Rec Contraire entered into before the huncfift Day of March One Thousand Seven hundred and fifty four Cousan quinity affinitie or any other lawfull Alian wheresoevr but that William Tompson of the Parish aforesaid & County aforesaid and Jesson of the Parish & County aforesaid Spinster

may lawfully solemnize Marriage together and in the same afterward lawfully remain and continue for man and wife according to the Laws in that Behalf provided And moreover if that be not at this present Time any Action suit plaint Quarrel or Demand made or depending before any Judge Ensignsitol or Temporal for or concerning any such lawfull Imprudiment without the said Parishes nor that tittle of him be of any other Parish or of better Estate or degree than to the Judge or granting of the same is suggested and by him sworn to before

And lastly if the same Marriage shall be openly consummated in the Church or Chapel in the time appointed between the Hours appointed in the Constitution Ecclesiastical confirmed and according to the form of the Book of Common Prayer now by Law established And if the above bounden William Tompson doe any harmles the said Rev. Joseph Delves his Successors and others his Offspring wheresoever by reason of this Obligation to be void or not to remain in full force and effect
