

NEWBOROUGH is a chapelry in the parish of Hanbury, and northern division of the hundred of Offlow; the village being situate about three miles E. from Abbots Bromley. The chapel is dedicated to All Saints; the living is a perpetual curacy, in the patronage of the

vicar of Hanbury. The charities consist of a free school for thirty girls, supported by Mrs. Hall, of Holly bush; and another erected by subscription, in which twelve boys are gratuitously instructed. The chapelry contained, in 1831, 757 inhabitants, and in 1841, 731.
