## PETITION FOR NATURALIZATION

To the Honorable the Supreme Court of New York  
 The petition of Maszily Kosty hereby filed, respectfully sheweth:

First. My place of residence is 158 6. Tioga Ave Corning N.Y. (Give number, street, city or town, and State.)

Second. My occupation is Glass Worker

Third. I was born on the 20<sup>th</sup> day of December, anno Domini 1884, at Takcsany, Austria

Fourth. I emigrated to the United States from Hamburg Germany on about the 13<sup>th</sup> day of Sept  
 anno Domini 1903, and arrived in the United States, at the port of New York, on the 25<sup>th</sup> day of Sept  
 anno Domini 1903, on the vessel (Do not Remember Name) (If the alien arrived otherwise than by vessel, the character of conveyance or name of transportation company should be given.)

Fifth. I declared my intention to become a citizen of the United States on the 27<sup>th</sup> day of May, anno Domini 1917  
 at Corning, in the Supreme Court of New York

Sixth. I am married. My wife's name is Mary Kosty. She was born Austria, and now resides at 158 6. Tioga Ave Corning N.Y. (Give number, street, city or town, and State.)

I have 7 children, and the name, date and place of birth, and place of residence of each of said children is as follows:

Seventh. I am not a disbeliever in or opposed to organized government or a member of or affiliated with any organization or body of persons teaching disbelief in or opposed to organized government. I am not a polygamist nor a believer in the practice of polygamy. I am attached to the principles of the Constitution of the United States, and it is my intention to become a citizen of the United States and to renounce absolutely and forever all allegiance and fidelity to any foreign prince, potentate, state, or sovereignty, and particularly to The Present Government of Austria of whom at this time I am a subject, and it is my intention to reside permanently in the United States.

Eighth. I am able to speak the English language.

Ninth. I have resided continuously in the United States of America for the term of five years at least immediately preceding the date of this petition, to wit, since the 25<sup>th</sup> day of Sept, anno Domini 1903, and in the State of New York, continuously next preceding the date of this petition, since the 25<sup>th</sup> day of September, anno Domini 1903, being a residence within this State of at least one year next preceding the date of this petition.

Tenth. I have not heretofore made petition for citizenship to any court.
