that he was the Natural and lawful Son
of the said deceased and the person entitled to Letters
of Administration of his Goods and personal
Estate Wherefore he prayed the same to be
granted to him which the Surrogate aforesaid
upon his taking the usual Oath and giving
good Security decreed accordingly. —

Know all Men by these Presents that We **William Tompson** of the parish of Abbots Bromley in the County of Stafford Farmer **William Mason of Litchfield** Clerk in the same County Writing Clerk and **John Doe** archdeacon and firmly bound unto **Edmund Outram** Doctor in Divinity Vicar General of the Diocese of Litchfield and Coventry in One Thousand Pounds of good and lawful Money of Great Britain to be paid unto the said **Edmund Outram** or to his certain Attorney his Executors Administrators or Assigns For which Payment well and truly to be made We oblige ourselves and every one of us by himself and themselves for the whole our and every one of our Heirs Executors and Administrators firmly by these Presents Sealed with our Seals dated the fifteenth day of March in the fifty sixth Year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord George the Third by the Grace of God of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland King Defender of the Faith &c And in the Year of our Lord One Thousand Eight Hundred and sixteen.



The Condition of this Obligation is such That if the above bounden **William Tompson** Administrator of all and singular the Goods Chattles and Credits of his late Father **William Tompson** deceased do make or cause to be made a true and perfect Inventory of all and singular the Goods Chattles and Credits of the said deceased which have or shall come to the Hands Possession or Knowledge of him the said **William Tompson** or into the Hands and Possession of any Person or Persons for him and the same so made do exhibit or cause to be exhibited into the Registry of the Bishops Court at Litchfield at or before the fifteenth day of June next ensuing and the same Goods Chattles and Credits and all other the Goods Chattles and Credits of the said deceased at the time of his death which at any time after shall come to the hands or Possession of the said **William Tompson** or into the hands and Possession of any other Person or Persons for him do well and truly administer according to Law And further do make or cause to be made a true and just Account of his said Administration at or before the sixteenth day of March 1817 and all the Rest and Residue of the said Goods Chattles and Credits which shall be found remaining upon the said Administrators Account the same being first examined and allowed of by the Judge or Judges for the time being of the said Court shall deliver and pay unto such Person or Persons respectively as the said Judge or Judges by his or their Decree or Sentence pursuant to the true Intent and Meaning of a late Act of Parliament made in the two and twentieth and three and twentieth Years of the Reign of our late Sovereign Lord King Charles the Second intituled an Act for the better settling of Intestates Estates shall limit and appoint And if it shall hereafter appear that any last Will and Testament was made by the said deceased and the Executor or Executors therein named do exhibit the same into the said Court making Request to have it allowed and approved accordingly if the said **William Tompson** above bounden being thereunto required do render and deliver the said Letters of Administration & Approbation of such Testament being first had and made in the said Court then this Obligation to be void or else to remain in full Force and Virtue
