1816 Before the Reverend Charles Buckridge D.D.
Surrogate &c

Appeared personally William Thompson
and suggested that William Thompson
late of the parish of Abbott Bromley
in the County of Stafford and Diocese of Lichfield
and Coventry, deceased died upwards of
fourteen days since Intestate a Widower
that he was the Natural and lawful Son
of the said deceased and the person entitled to Letters
of Administration of his Goods and Personal
Estate Wherefore he prayed the same to be
granted to him which the Surrogate aforesaid
upon his taking the usual Oath and giving
good Security decreed accordingly. —

Day when he died
On: 26th October 1815

The said William Thompson
was then duly sworn as also that the
personal Estate does not amount
to six hundred Pounds

or Assigns to which Payment well and truly to be made we oblige ourselves
and every one of us by himself and them selves for the whole our and
every one of our Stars Executors and Administrators firmly by
these Presents Sealed with our Seals dated the fifteenth day of
March in the Fifty Sixth Year of the Reign of our Sovereign
Lord George the Third by the Grace of God of the United
Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland King Defender of the Faith &c And
in the Year of our Lord One Thousand Eight Hundred and Sixteen.

The Condition of this Obligation is such That if the above bounden
William Thompson Administrator of all and singular the Goods
Chattels and Credits of his late Father William Thompson deceased do
make or cause to be made a true and perfect Inventory of all and singular the Goods
Chattels and Credits of the said deceased which have or shall come to the Hands
Possession or Knowledge of him the said William Thompson
or into the Hands and Possession of any Person or Persons for
him and the same so made do exhibit or cause to be exhibited into the Registry
of the Bishops Court at Lichfield at or before the
fifteenth day of June next ensuing and the same Goods
Chattels and Credits and all other the Goods Chattels and Credits of the said deceased
at the time of his death which at any time after shall come to the hands or Possession
of the said William Thompson or into the hands
and Possession of any other Person or Persons for him do well and truly administer
according to Law and further do make or cause to be made a true and just Account
of his said Administration at or before the sixteenth day of March 1817
and all the Rest and Residue of the said Goods Chattels and Credits which shall
be found remaining upon the said Administrators Account the same being first
examined and allowed of by the Judge or Judges for the time being of the said
Court shall deliver and pay unto such Person or Persons respectively as the said
Judge or Judges by his or their Decree or Sentence pursuant to the true Intent and
Meaning of a late Act of Parliament made in the two and twentieth and three and
twentieth Years of the Reign of our late Sovereign Lord King Charles the Second
intituled an Act for the better settling of Intestates Estates shall limit and appoint
And if it shall hereafter appear that any last Will and Testament was made by the
said deceased and the Executor or Executors theran named do exhibit the same into
the said Court making Request to have it allowed and approved accordingly if the
above bounden being thereunto required do render and deliver the said Letters of
Administration & approbation of such Testament being first had and made in the
said Court then this Obligation to be void or else to remain in full Force and Virtue
