MISS Helen Louise Blount of this city and Edward Louis McCarthy of Syracuse, N. Y., were married at Saint Peter's Catholic church Saturday evening at 6 o'clock. Father Maurice McDonnell, pastor of the church, officiated.

The chancel was grouped with palms in front of which were two baskets of white snapdragons and greenery. On the altar were vases of white flowers flanked by candelabra holding cathedral tapers. Bill B. Gettys, organist, played "I Love You Truly" and "O Promise Me" before the ceremony. The wedding march from "Lohengrin" was played for the processional and Mendelssohn's march from "A Midsummer Night's Dream" for the recessional. During the service "Mother of Christ" was played.

The bride, given in marriage by Joseph Victor Mooney, wore a wedding gown with duchess satin bodice, sweetheart neckline, long sleeves ending in calla lily points over the hands, and net skirt with long train and full length veil worn with a coronet of pearlized orange blossoms. Her only ornament was a strand of pearls, gift of the bridegroom. She carried a white prayer book topped with white orchids and showered with lilies of the valley.

Mrs. Charles W. Burns was her sister's matron of honor. She wore a dress of ice blue satin and net elbow length gloves, Juliet cap and shoulder length veil. She carried an old fashioned nosegay of blue delphinium, pink snapdragons, and

yellow roses tied with a large blue bow.

The bridegroom had as his best man William E. Blount, cousin of the bride. The ushers were Charles William Burns and Albert C. Helms. Mrs. Hopkins, mother of the bride, wore a navy blue crepe dress, navy accessories, and a shoulder bouquet of red rosebuds.
