Assault ChargeInformation Supplied by Ralph
Rocco for Third Degree
Warrant

Arrested on a warrant charging him with assault in the third degree for an alleged attack upon Ralph Rocco, of this city, Rufus Hall, 64 Conhocton street, pleaded not guilty in City Court today.

City Judge Holland B. Williams has adjourned the case to Tuesday when, he states, attorneys will be called upon to reach agreement on the date of a possible jury trial in the case.

In the information which he supplied police and upon which the warrant was issued, Rocco claimed to have sustained severe head and face injuries. He said that Hall called him from his boarding house Monday evening and then attacked him with a club or a flashlight. Rocco was treated at Corning Hospital.

The warrant was issued today and Hall was immediately taken into custody. He claimed that he had justifiable reason for an attack although police declined to reveal this reason.

City Judge Williams reports that the assault case brought against Charles Kosty, Jr., by C. P. Bronson, 150 East Market street, had been compromised, Bronson having refused to press charges when Kosty paid for a window he was alleged to have broken in the Bronson residence.
