Appellate Court Denies Motion In Two Arson Cases

Verdict of Conviction in Cases Of Hornell Defendants Upheld; Serving Sentences

An appeal to set aside the verdict of conviction in two arson cases was denied by the Supreme Court, Appellate division in Rochester, according to information received here today by District Attorney George W. Pratt.

Michael Ross, Vito Polito and Pietro Cartello of Hornell, John Rechichi and James Messina and others, also of the same city, were the defendants in the cases. Polito and Cartello were sentenced to serve from 12 1-2 to 25 years in Attica State Prison and pay a fine of \$500; a \$500 fine was imposed upon Ross and sentence was suspended.

In a companion case tried in Schuyler County Court at Penn Yan last Fall, John Rechichi was sentenced to serve from 1 1-2 to 25 years in Attica prison, and to pay a fine of \$500. Messina was fined \$500 and received a suspended sentence.

The motion to set aside the verdict was argued by the defendant's counsel, Attorney Walter F. Cherry of Rochester, and opposed by District Attorney Pratt. The decision was reserved until the denial by order of the Appellate division was announced today.

The defendants were charged with the alleged firing of homes in Hornell during the past few years.

Pennsylvania Division Discontinues Passenger Trains To Williamsport

Three Defendants Plead Not Guilty In County Court

Charles Kosty to Stand Trial on Charge of Violating Parole; McAllister Pleads Guilty

BATH—Before Judge E. S. Brown in special term of Steuben County Court at Bath, Saturday, William Khork, Hornell, denied guilt of burglary third degree as charged in an indictment and was held in \$2,000 bail for trial.

Charles Kosty, Corning, denied guilt on the charge of having violated terms of parole and is held on \$2,500 bail for trial.

Laura Nesbitt, Hornell, denied guilt when charged with burglary third degree. She is held in \$500 bail.

Francis McAllister, Corning, pleaded guilty when charged with failure to provide for his dependent child. McAllister is released on his own recognizance, directed to seek employment that will enable him to contribute to the support of his dependent.

Prattsburg Will

Last Passenger and Express Service Run On Saturday; Motor Service Substituted

WELLSBORO, Pa.—The Pennsylvania division of the New York Central Railroad carried its last passenger and express business between Lawrenceville and Williamsport on Saturday, bringing to a final conclusion the four-year struggle between the railroad company and the Wellsboro Chamber of Commerce with regard to discontinuance of the service.

Somewhat ironically, in view of the fact that disappearing passenger traffic was the factor which forced discontinuance, the two trains, one and four, carried a large number of passengers on their final runs.

Permission was granted the road by the Pennsylvania Public Service Commission to discontinue the trains, at a re-hearing recently. The Commission had previously over-ruled the petition to end the service, but granted the re-hearing when officials of the company stated that they desired to introduce new evidence.

The long controversy began in the spring of 1931, when high officials of the New York Central company visited Wellsboro, lunching with officials of the Wellsboro Chamber of Commerce, and asked co-operation of Wellsboro people in the effort to reduce financial losses suffered through the service.
