

# Wellsboro Youth, Accidentally Shot By Companion, In Serious Condition

Leonard Fischler, 18, in Serious Condition in Blossburg Hospiital When Bullet From Rifle of George Kosty of Corning Penetrates Abdomen.

**Wellsboro, June 23.**—A bullet, accidentally discharged from a .22 rifle in the hands of George Kosty, 13, of Corning, penetrating the abdomen of Leonard Fischler, 18 years old son of Mr. and Mrs. Samuel Fischler of R. F. D., No. 7, Monday afternoon at 4:15 o'clock, the young man lies in the Blossburg State Hospital in a serious condition. The spleen was injured by the bullet, it is said.

The young men had been hunting ground hogs and had returned to the Fischler home where the boy was peeling potatoes and Kosty sitting in front of him with the rifle in hand. The weapon was discharged in an accidental manner.

The injured youth was removed, after first aid had been administered by Dr. J. G. Webster of Wellsboro, to the hospital at Blossburg where an operation was performed by Dr. L. G. Cole.
