OBITUARY



FRED WILLIAMS

ADDISON — The funeral of Fred Williams of Orr Hill was held Monday afternoon at 2 o'clock from his late home. The Rev. Eugene Cole of Bathbone, retired Methodist minister, assisted by the Rev. Clarence H. Nas, pastor of the Addison and Orr Hill Methodist Episcopal Churches, officiated. Interment was in Orr Hill Cemetery.

The bearers were Matthew Clark, Leon Andrews, Herman Clark of Orr Hill, and Ralph Hand of Freeman.

The funeral was well attended and the floral tributes numerous. Mr. Williams' death resulted from a skull fracture sustained Wednesday afternoon about 5 o'clock, when kicked by one of his horses which was hitched to a hay fork and drawing off hay on Mr. Williams' farm. One of his grandsons, Edward Housel of Orr Hill, was working with him and went quickly to his aid. It is thought the horse might have been bitten by a bee or horse-fly as it had been gentle always. Mr. Williams was removed to his home where he regained consciousness for about a half hour and then lapsed back into unconsciousness. Death occurred Friday night at 9:30 P. M.

Charles Bundza Kosty, Sr., 174 East Market street died at his home at 3:45 a. m. today after being ill for the past eight months. He was 55 years old.

He was born January 8, 1884, in what was later Czechoslovakia and came to America from Austria-Hungary in 1903, entering the employ of Corning Glass Works where he worked for 36 years. His parents were Mr. and Mrs. Michael Kosty. About 31 years ago he married Miss Mary Kuchner in Elmira.

Mr. Kosty was a member of St. Mary's Greek Catholic Church of Eastern Rite and of the Greek Catholic Society.

Survivors are: his widow; 11 children, Michael, Alexander, Joseph Andrew and Elizabeth, at home; Charles, Jr., George B., John V., Mrs. Otto Weizel, Mrs. Michael Gonta and Catherine Kosty, all of Corning; two sisters, Mary and Anna, in Czechoslovakia; nephews in Corning and four in Czechoslovakia; a niece in New York and a niece in Canada.

The funeral will be held Thursday morning at 8:30 o'clock at the residence and at 9 o'clock at St. Mary's Greek Catholic Church of Eastern Rite. Burial will be in St. Mary's Roman Catholic Cemetery.
