To Paint Bridges At Post, Addison

Two Southern Steuben bridges will get new coats of paint this summer under a contract to be let by the State Highway Department. These are the Conhocton River bridge at Painted Post, and the bridge over Tuscarora Creek, near the Hollis farm, on the Jackson-Addison Road, about three miles west of South Addison.

These are among six bridges covered by the contract, for which the low bid received Wednesday at Albany was \$11,370, from the Central Concrete Company of Pittsburgh, Pa. There were 10 other offers, ranging to a high of \$32,000. Engineer's estimate for the work was \$34,430.

BATH — The case against Jerry Bath, charged with negligence, drew to a close today. Sgt. C. G. Burnett and Thomas Clark testified about the accident, which occurred on July 18, 1937, in which the body of Kenka was found. Six witnesses stand as the trial closes today. The case is expected to be decided by the jury Friday.

Mrs. Lauraine, sister of the dead woman, appeared in court today, overcome, as Sgt. Bath described the scene of the accident. He said he found the body lying in the blood on the windshield of the car and on the fender of the
