WATER SPILLED

Alfred Caudrey, 142, Prince-street, Derby, was summoned by Minnie Ravenscroft, 144, Prince-street, at Derby Borough Police Court to-day for alleged assault. Caudrey cross-summoned Mrs. Ravenscroft for alleged assault.

Ravenscroft said that she was cleaning the yard when Caudrey came past with his bicycle. It caught the bucket, and the water went over him. He attacked her, and followed her into the house and punched her. She had bruises on her arms and leg, and her face was bleeding.

"THREW IT OVER HIM"

Caudrey said that Mrs. Ravenscroft deliberately threw the bucket of water over him, and threatened him with a saucepan of boiling water. Then she "came at him" with a brush, which he took from her and threw over the wall. He had not spoken to Mrs. Ravenscroft for three and a half years, he said.

When Ravenscroft cross-examined him, Caudrey answered "You're queen of the earth—yard foreman." Later he said "You're a modern Amazon. You have hit cosmen and dustmen."
