GOTTLIEB GRIEB DIES FROM HEAT

Gottlieb Grieb, 75, employe of the department of parks and formerly one of four police commissioners in the McGuire administration, died early last night at his home, 213 Carbon st., after 10 weeks' illness. A heart condition, aggravated by the heat, caused his death.

A native Syracusan, he had lived in this city all his life, receiving his education here and entered politics early in life. He served for two years as a police commissioner and later became a superintendent in the former city sidewalk department.

At one time Mr. Grieb was a Republican candidate for alderman of the First ward. For many years he had been a cigarmaker on the north side.

Surviving are his wife, Mrs. Susanna Filsinger Grieb; four sons, Thomas, Rodger, Rowland and Lincoln Grieb; five daughters, Mrs. Lewis North of Pulaski, Mrs. Albert Wright, Mrs. Herman Kohlman, Mrs. Richard Feigel and Mrs. Ora Manwaring; 24 grandchildren; three great-grandchildren; a brother, Henry Grieb, and four sisters, Mrs. Elizabeth Kuhn of Chicago, Mrs. Otto Kuhn, Mrs. Robert Tasker and Mrs. Jasper Salisbury.

After private funeral services are conducted at the home in Carbon st. at 2 p. m. Tuesday, burial will be in Morningside cemetery.
